



JCOD Celebrates Second Chance Month Across All Five Supervisorial Districts

The month of April marked Second Chance Month and National Reentry Week. JCOD got into the spirit and actively participated in events across all five Supervisorial Districts of Los Angeles County. Each event supported community members with an emphasis on addressing the unique needs of justice-involved individuals and strengthening community ties.

Supervisorial District 1 - Homeboy Industries Community Resource Fair



Second Chance Month kicked off on April 5th in Downtown Los Angeles where JCOD collaborated with Homeboy Industries to host a community resource fair. Attendees were linked to services for job training, mental health, legal aid, and supported individuals in their journey toward successful reentry back into their communities. JCOD was joined by First District Supervisor Hilda Solis and Father Gregory Boyle who greeted attendees.

Supervisorial District 2 - Watts Labor Community Action Committee (WLCAC) Resource Fair



WLCAC partnered with JCOD on April 26th to close out Second Chance Month and National Reentry Week. The event featured resource booths linking attendees with employment opportunities, financial education, and reentry services.

Supervisorial District 3 – JCOD Providing Opportunities for Women in Reentry (POWR) Housing Site Grand Opening



A major highlight during Second Chance Month was the grand opening of the new POWR housing site in Arleta. The grand opening on April 17th was by Center for Living and Learning. This facility offers comprehensive support for women, including safe housing, employment opportunities, family reunification and substance abuse treatment.

Supervisorial District 4 – Diversity, Equity, Inclusion Accessibility (DEIA) and Second Chance Month Event



On April 10th, Long Beach City College in partnership with JCOD, LA County Probation Department, and the City of Long Beach hosted a resource fair at their Pacific Coast Campus. The fair put a spotlight on Second Chance Month and kicked off DEIA Month with providers sharing various community resources.

Supervisorial District 5 – Ribbon Cutting Ceremony of Our Healing Space, A Wellness Experience



On April 25th, JCOD participated in the ribbon-cutting ceremony for Paving the Way Foundation's Our Healing Space, A Wellness Experience in Lancaster. This new wellness center is scheduled to open this summer and will offer therapy, community classes, gardening, and additional programming to support justice-involved individuals.

JCOD's Justice Connect Support Center Celebrates 2,000 Calls!



Over 2,000 individuals helped since 10/2023

JCOD's Justice Connect Support Center reached a significant milestone on April 30, by processing its 2,000th service call since its launch in October 2023. The Support Center

has been a vital resource for LA County residents who have been arrested, are facing court proceedings, or who have been released from jail including support to their families.

Justice Connect is toll-free at 833-LAC-JCOD (833-522-5263) and is available seven days a week from 6:00 AM to 11:00 PM and offers a comprehensive range of services, including transportation, court reminders and care management. For more details, visit justiceconnect.org.


